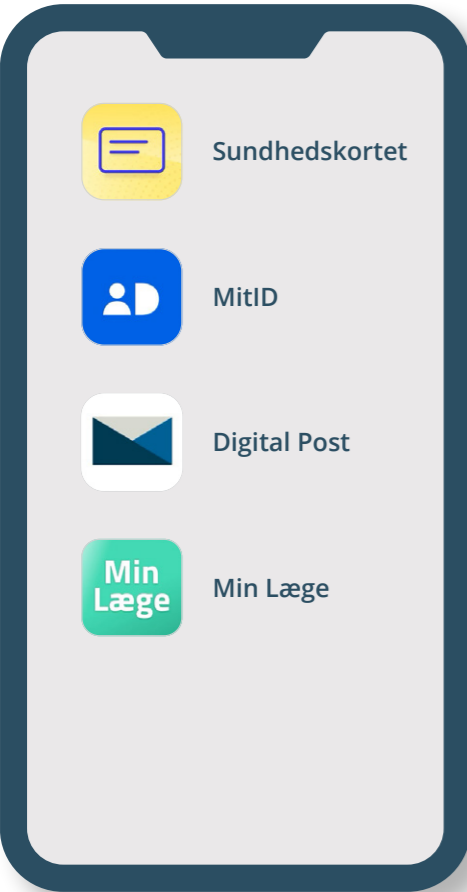


Welcome to Digital Denmark

1 Find a job
Finding a job before moving is a good idea. If you make the move without a job, however, you should consider starting your job search with one of International House Copenhagen's career programmes.



2 Get an EU residence document
You can apply for an EU residence document online and have it issued at the Danish Agency for International Recruitment and Integration (SIRI).



3 Find a home and get a permanent address
A roof over your head is crucial, though not always easy to find. Get your head around the housing market.



4 Register as a citizen – get a CPR number
You can apply for a CPR number at International House Copenhagen, if you have a place to live and plan to stay in Denmark for more than 3 months.



5 Get a MitID
The Danish national eID, MitID, is your personal key to digital services in Denmark.



6 Get your yellow health insurance card
Your yellow health insurance card is on the way, but it can take 2-4 weeks – so please be patient and make sure your name is clearly stated on your mailbox.



7 Get a tax card
Tax can be tricky. That's why the Danish Tax Agency (SKAT) is here to help you. You must apply for your tax card online.



8 Open a bank account
You can open a bank account by reaching out to any bank of your own choice.

9 Change your driving licence
You can exchange your driving license to a Danish driving license if you have residence in Denmark.



10 Read your Digital Post
Denmark is one of the most digitised countries in the world with Digital Post being its cornerstone. The sooner you get started, the better.



11 Start learning Danish
Snakker du dansk? You may very soon because the opportunities to learn and practice are many.



12 Join a club or association
The culture and leisure scene is rich in Greater Copenhagen. International House Copenhagen can help you get started with a broad range of free events.



13 Notify your municipality of your decision to leave Denmark
Leaving Denmark sometimes requires deregistering your Danish address. You can learn more on how to report your departure to the authorities here.
