



## Remember to inform us of your health insurance country

When you are new in Denmark, you must inform us of your health insurance country once you have registered with the Danish National Register and are entitled to use the Danish health service.

This guide tells you what you should do. We need the information to register your health insurance country. This is the country that must pay when you use the Danish health service.

### Who is required to provide health insurance country information?

You must provide us with a few details if you are over 18 years of age and:

- are a citizen of an EU/EEA country\* or Switzerland *or*
- have lived in an EU/EEA country\* or Switzerland immediately before coming to Denmark.

#### Are you a Danish citizen?

If you are a Danish citizen and came to Denmark from another EU/EEA country or Switzerland, you must also inform us of your health insurance country.

### How to submit information

1. Go to [www.borger.dk/sygesikringsland](http://www.borger.dk/sygesikringsland)
2. Log on using your Danish civil registration (CPR) number
3. Fill in the fields and attach any relevant documentation.
